Parent and Training Information Center (PTI):

North Dakota's federally designated PTI supports families of children with disabilities (birth-26) to:

- Understand educational rights and disability supports
- Navigate IEPs and collaborate with school staff
- Access statewide services and resources
- Support youth with self-advocacy skills
- Share knowledge with professionals and partner organizations

Continuum of Care Program (COC):

Helping rural youth (ages 14–24) at risk of or experiencing homelessness:

- · One-on-one guidance from staff with lived experience
- Individualized Plans of Action (POAs) for:
 - Housing stability
 - · Crisis and safety planning
 - Family and community connection
 - Education, employment, and health services
- Access to ND Housing Hub:
 - Statewide navigation of housing-related resources
 - Quick connection to shelter, food, jobs, and health

PSND Broadway Circle (PBC):

PBC prevents family separation and provides transitional housing and wrap-around support toward permanent housing:

- · PBC Family Homeless Shelter: 6 two and three-bedroom family units
- PBC LMI Complex: 17 efficiency, one, and two-bedroom units for Low to Moderate Income (LMI) qualifiers
- Support Services: assure families receive the resources and services they need to successfully shift into longterm permanent housing.
